This year I will be participating in the L3 professional development course. It's a great opportunity to network with other early year's teachers learning the latest teaching methods in reading & writing for K-Yr 2 students.

All students have nightly reading homework and the Yr 3-6 students also have their personal spelling words to learn. The best way to learn them is using the Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check method. Many of the students also have lists of words to practise reading with the younger children having word cards as well to play games with. The school subscribes to 2 online programs: Mathletics & Reading Eggs. If any parents would like their child to use these programs at home please ask us for your child's logons. Anything parents can do to encourage their child to read and learn basic number facts will greatly assist your child. Soon the Year 2-6 children will bring home lists of basic number facts to learn. Helping your child instantly recall basic number facts allows them to solve more complicated number problems easier. Thanks for your assistance in helping your child consolidate skills learnt at school.
